In times of difficulty, (Water 3 starts)

SONG: All You Works of God

CALL TO CONFESSION - JP 1 (from pulpit)

God created us in God's own image and called us to be different—unique and beloved creations—equipped to follow God's call in each of our lives. Yet from the very beginning, God's own children set aside their call to live faithfully with God, trusting God to provide. Instead they sought conformity and power.

IP 2 (on handheld from font)

As we heard in Genesis 11, when the people settled together, they were all the same: using the same language and the same words. And they began to build a place for themselves and a name for themselves, conforming so that there was no difference among them as they built a tower to the heavens. But when the Lord saw their desire to be the same, God scattered them abroad, giving them different speech and diversity of place and

space and culture. And they called it Babel because the Lord confused their language and scattered them across the earth.

Like those at Babel, we find ourselves scattered,

unable to see our difference as a gift instead of a threat,

needing to confess our sin.

Like those at Babel, we find God present among us,

able to see us for who we really are,

descending to us to deliver us.

So let us confess our sin.

CONFESSION - 2 IP's at pulpit and at font

One: Creating God, you made us each in your image and called us very good.

All: But we try to conform,

dressing alike, trying to be cool,

longing to fit in with the crowd.

We struggle to see who we really are.

One: God asks us: who are you?

Pulpit side: I am unique.
Piano side: I am creative.
Pulpit side: I am different.
Piano side: I am ordinary.

All: Lam a beloved child of God.

One: Loving God, you claim us while we are still being knit together in our mothers' wombs.

In the waters of baptism, your claim is sealed on our lives.

All: But we want to define ourselves,

filling our minds with doubts and questions,

rejecting God's promises,

wanting to control our own lives.

We fail to trust your claim on us.

One: God asks us: who are you?
Pulpit side: I am a doubter.
Piano side: I am a believer.
Pulpit side: I am certain.
Piano side: I am curious.

All: I am a beloved child of God.

One: Calling God, your Spirit calls us to use our gifts to follow the unique call on each of our lives.

All: But we are easily blinded,

unable to see our own gifts, uncertain of where we are to go, tempted to just follow the crowd.

We cannot see that our differences are needed for your call.

One: God asks us: who are you?

Pulpit side: I am a leader.
Piano side: I am a follower.
Pulpit side: I am called by God.
Piano side: I am sent by God.

All: I am a beloved child of God.

ASSURANCE OF PARDON

IP from pulpit will serve as liturgist. Several IPs will model the action below on the stage.

Beloved, each of you is made in the image of God. Bearing that image, you are claimed and called as God's own. Bearing that image, you always walk in God's light. Bearing that image, you are always reflecting God's light to others.

To be made in the image of God is to carry with you God's name—Yahweh—in your image. [Hebrew slide] In Hebrew, the name of God is spelled with four letters—yod, hey, vav, hey--read right to left.



Trace the image of God in yourself. The yod follows the shape of the face. The hey forms the shoulders and arms. The vav traces your torso. The final hey forms your hips and legs. Each of you bears God's name in your very being.

Now silently turn to your neighbor. In the space in front of your neighbor, trace the name of God in them. Yod-Hey-Vav-Hey. Your neighbor also bears God's name in their very being.

Now that you are able to see the image of God in yourself and your neighbor, we offer one another God's grace by saying together:

Made in the image of God, you are forgiven.

Sung Peace—Salaam Aleikum (Ghana) (alternating Arabic and English)

Blessing at the Water

Water is a way we encounter the sacredness of God and are reminded of God's blessing on each of us. For many of you, this water may remind you of your baptism. For all of you, this water points you to a God who created, called, delivered, and blessed us with water. Those who thirst for God's love are invited to come forward to receive a blessing, a reminder of your belovedness.

As you feel led, you are invited to peacefully come forward to one of twelve stations in front of your section to receive a blessing with the water from one of your small group leaders. As the cross is marked on your forehead, you will hear God's truest promise to each of you: "you are a beloved child of God." While you wait for the blessing we invite you to hold each other in song.

All: We think first of our parents and siblings, High voices: grandparents and great grandparents,

Low voices: aunts, uncles, and cousins.

One: We often wonder, "Who is my family? To whom do I belong?"

All: We include our church family, High voices: adopted parents, step-parents, Low voices: and friends who are like family.

One: We often wonder, "Who is my family? To whom do I belong?"

All: We come from loving families High voices: and messy, complicated families,

Low voices: and broken families, and mixed-up families.

One: We gather as a Christian family to worship,

knowing that Jesus asked the same questions. "Who is my family? To whom do I belong?"

All: Jesus had a long family tree
High voices: full of promise and deliverance,
Low voices: with misfits and adoptions,

Adult voices: betrayal and reunion,

Youth voices: love and hope.

One: And if Jesus' family was bigger and more complicated than we can imagine,

All: then we belong in God's family too.

GENEALOGY OF JESUS

One: As we worship God as a family, let us listen to Jesus' family tree,

which by our adoption in Christ is our family too, as told in the Gospel of Matthew, the first chapter.

Movement during genealogy:

Genealogy begins with handbell at back Reader moves along with the big Christ candle (lighted) –
Two additional readers are throughout the auditorium.
After each set of 14 generations, reader stops and new reader takes over
New bell rings - candle remains constantly moving toward front.

Four "interrupters" are also scattered throughout the auditorium.

They will insert themselves in places where the family tree has an interesting addition Bells of dischord ring when something is askew in the family tree?

Procession of readers finishes somewhere in the room but not on stage Ends with a bell tone. Christ candle brought to the stage as song begins.

Reader 1: Abraham was the father of Isaac, and Isaac the father of Jacob, and Jacob the father of Judah and his brothers, and Judah the father of Perez and Zerah

Interrupted by a voice in the crowd:

Father of Perez and Zerah *by Tamar*, the Canaanite woman who was married, widowed, remarried her husband's brother, widowed again, faked prostitution, and was saved by her own trickery.

Reader 1 continues: and Perez the father of Hezron,
and Hezron the father of Aram,
and Aram the father of Aminadab...
and Aminadab the father of Nahshon,
and Nahshon the father of Salmon,
and Salmon the father of Boaz...

Interrupted by a second voice in the crowd:

Father of Boaz by Rahab,

The prostitute in Jericho that hid Joshua's spies to protect them.

Reader 1 continues: and Boaz the father of Obed

Interrupted by a third voice in the crowd:

The father of Obed by Ruth!

the Moabite woman who was widowed and clung to her mother-in-law Naomi's family, converted and married Boaz whom she met while gleaning the fields.

Reader 1 continues: and Obed the father of Jesse, and Jesse the father of King David.

Reader: And David was the father of Solomon

Interrupted by a fourth voice in the crowd:

David and **the wife of Uriah,** better known as Bathsheba, The Hittite woman that David caught sunbathing and fell in love with, whose

husband Uriah, David had killed on the battlefield.

Reader: and Solomon the father of Rehoboam,

and Rehoboam the father of Abijah, and Abijah the father of Asaph, and Asaph the father of Jehoshaphat, and Jehoshaphat the father of Joram, and Joram the father of Uzziah, and Uzziah the father of Jotham, and Jotham the father of Ahaz, and Ahaz the father of Hezekiah, and Hezekiah the father of Manasseh, and Manasseh the father of Amos, and Amos the father of Josiah, and Josiah the father of Jechoniah and his brothers, at the time of the deportation to Babylon.

All 4 interrupters: Deportation and exile!

Reader: And after the deportation to Babylon:

Jechoniah was the father of Salathiel, and Salathiel the father of Zerubbabel, and Zerubbabel the father of Abiud, and Abiud the father of Eliakim, and Eliakim the father of Azor, and Azor the father of Zadok, and Zadok the father of Achim, and Achim the father of Eliud, and Eliud the father of Eleazar,

and Eleazar the father of Matthan, and Matthan the father of Jacob, and Jacob the father of Joseph

Interrupter 4: the husband of Mary, the young woman whom the angel Gabriel

called to be the bearer of the Christ child

Reader: of whom Jesus was born, who is called the Messiah.

SONG: Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus

CALL TO CONFESSION

When we gather as a family at Montreat, it's easy to love each other and to call one another brothers and sisters in Christ. But just like Jesus' family tree, true family is complicated and messy. Trusting that by God's grace we are all already included in God's family, we gather to confess the ways we struggle to be family well. Let us pray:

God, our Holy Parent, we confess that we are not always obedient children. Being part of your family is harder than we think. We are quick to judge rather than love our brothers and sisters. We would rather limit who's in than welcome those different than us. We prefer to remain by ourselves rather than being exposed for who we really are. Like a loving Parent, forgive us. Guide us. Empower us. Expand our field of vision for who belongs, that by welcoming others we too might be welcomed, in Jesus' name we pray, Amen.

ASSURANCE OF PARDON

Friends, hear and believe this good news. Each of us has been engrafted into Jesus' family tree, a family much bigger, wider, and messier than we can imagine. In this family, there is nothing you can do to make God love you any more. And there is nothing you can do to make God love you any less. You belong in God's family just as you are.

All: Alleluia, Amen.

Sung Response: God Welcomes All with sung Amen

God welcomes all, strangers and friends; God's love is strong and it never ends. Amen.

PRAYER FOR ILLUMINATION

Speak truth to us as only family can. Speak hope to us as only a loving parent can. Speak joy to us as only a true friend can. Speak your Word to us as only you, our Living God, can.

SONG - For Everyone Born

PRAYER OF THE FAMILY

We gather to pray as a family of faith, connected in obvious and sometimes unexpected ways. Please stand and turn toward the center of the auditorium to face one another as we pray together that we might see the diverse and beautiful faces of those we call family. You are invited to leave your eyes open during the prayer, so that like the blind man we too might see anew. Let us pray.

From center of aud:

Holy God, we give thanks for the ways that you have knit us together as family, connecting the dots not just through blood relatives but through bread broken and love poured out, so that we all might be engrafted into your family tree. We give thanks just like Jesus' family tree reaches back to David and Abraham, through exile and disruption, Jesus' family tree also extends outward to reach each and every one of us.

Interrupter 1:

We celebrate that Jesus' family tree includes the blind man who regained his sight, and his parents, and the whiny Pharisees, and the doubting neighbors.

Interrupter 3:

We rejoice that Jesus' family tree includes the school bus driver of X and the youth leader of Y and the friends of Z, and we dare to believe that the family includes both bully who beat up A and A himself.

Interrupter 2:

We give thanks that Jesus' family tree includes B's lab partner, and C's teammate, and the archrival of D, and the classmate of E.

Interrupter 4:

Our eyes are opened so that we can see that Jesus' family tree includes the store clerk at Ingles and the panhandler off I-40, the guy scooping ice cream at Kilwins, and the neighbors who live closeby but have never driven through the Montreat gates, the summer staff who make worship possible and the youth leaders who prepare meals for back home groups.

Interrupter 1:

We yearn for a love wide enough that Jesus' family tree can include those who live according to their gender identity *and* those who have persecuted them, and political leaders who struggle to see eye to eye.

Interrupter 3:

We pray for a family tree that stretches so broadly that it can include Americans and Haitians, Syrians and Afghanis, Indians and Pakistanis, South Africans and Nigerians, Koreans and Japanese and those all across the globe.

From center of aud:

Break down the barriers that prevent us from being family. Empower us to use our voice to testify to the love found when we live as one. Challenge us to see with new eyes the person right in front of us as a brother or sister in Christ. Convict us when we are too quick to judge. Hold your whole family together with the unbreakable bond of love poured out by your Son for us all. It is through Christ our brother that we pray, Amen.

OFFERING

All that we are and that we will be comes from God. To offer our whole selves to God, we offer not just our financial gifts but our prayers and our commitments as well. We will begin the offering with a time of silence. During that time, you are invited to distribute the note cards and pencils at the end of your pew. Begin in prayer by writing down a person or group of people that you will try to include in the family tree to make it more reflective of Jesus' messy, wide, and loving family.

Jesus' family tree is messy, wide and loving.

Who has not belonged that should? Who is it you feel is left out who should belong?

As the offering plates are passed, you are invited to offer your financial gifts to support Montreat Conference Center and the Young Adult Volunteer program. Doing so supports the church family right here in Montreat and young adults all across the globe. In the same basket, you are also

invited to offer up your prayer card. By adding your prayer card, you are offering to try your best to include that person or group of people in Christ's family. Some of these cards will be incorporated into prayers in worship later in the week.

One: On this ordinary day, in this ordinary place, among ordinary people,

All: Christ is here.

One: At the top of Lookout, in the lunch line at the Inn,

by the creek, at the Huck,

All: Christ is there.

One: In your classroom, in your youth lounge,

at the grocery story, on the street corner,

All: Christ is there.

One: When you feel your best, when you can't stop tears,

when wandering and lost, when walking with purpose,

All: Christ is there.

One: By the lake, at breakfast time, on a cloudy day, in the midst of grief,

All: Christ is there.

One: On this night, among squeaky pews and sweaty worshippers, All: Christ is here. Let us worship God who is present among us.

SCRIPTURE READING

Tonight we hear a reading from the final chapter of the Gospel of John. After Jesus was crucified and buried, on the first day of the week, Mary went to the tomb and discovered the stone rolled away and Jesus appeared to her in a garden. Jesus then appeared to his disciples who were hanging out in a locked room, grieving from the loss of their friend and afraid that they were next. But eventually the disciples went back to their ordinary lives and their ordinary work.

The Gospel of John, the 21st chapter:

Gathered there together were Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples. Simon Peter said to them, 'I am going fishing.' They said to him, 'We will go with you.' They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. [And on that ordinary day], just after daybreak, Jesus stood on the beach; but the disciples did not know that it was Jesus.

This is the Word of the Lord, **Thanks be to God.**

Call to Confession/Prayer

Sometimes our prayers of confession feel like a laundry list of things we have done or not done and we wonder if we can relate. But true confession invites us to place before a graceful God the things that hold us captive so that we are set free to meet the risen Christ and receive his invitation to love.

Instead of a spoken prayer of confession tonight, you are invited to spend some time in silent reflection. We will have three times of prayerful contemplation, each with a question to ponder and an action you may choose to use to help you focus your prayer. We will allow 2 minutes for each question. For some of you this will feel like a long time; for others this is just the beginning of a life-long practice of prayerful contemplation that can connect you to God. Regardless, we invite each of you to try this now and to respect and love your neighbor by honoring their ability to pray as well. We will end each period of prayerful reflection with release in song.

Action: Clench your fists.

Question to pray and ponder (x2) and repeat again at 1 min mark:

What are you holding onto that prevents you from loving God?

Action: Fold your hands in prayer.

Question to pray and ponder:

Who can help you let go?

Action: Open your palms upward.
Question to pray and ponder:

What could you receive from God if you were free?
